Why Memorize The Word of God?

1. Memorizing God's Word supplies spiritual power.
 - a. Knowing God's Word puts up a strong defense against sin.
 - b. It places the sword of the Spirit in our hands, so that, in a given moment, whether we have a physical Bible on us or not, we can drive off temptation to sin.
2. Memorizing God's Word deepens our understanding of God and His will.
 - a. His words become rooted in our hearts and minds, readily available for reflection and application in our lives.
 - b. Committing Bible passages to memory puts them at our fingertips to encourage each other.
3. Memorizing God's Word makes us wise.
 - a. Scripture gives us wisdom for life.
 - b. It helps us give godly advice to those in need.

How to Memorize the Word of God?

1. First, disregard the devil telling you, you can't do it.
2. Start small.
 - a. Pray and ask God what to memorize and to help you do it.
3. Build review into your memorization plan.
4. Memorize scripture in context, out loud, and in company.

Counterarguing Excuses

1. I don't have a good memory.

Ask the Lord to do this for you!

2. It will take too much time.

The more Scripture begins to transform our priorities, the more we will want to invest our time, energy, and resources in those things that most glorify God.

3. I've tried it before and it didn't work.

The enemy of Scripture memorization is giving up.

4. I read the Bible every day. Why should I memorize it?

Scripture memorization is not a replacement for daily Bible reading, but rather a supplement.
