III. What do I do with it? (Application)

Application is putting the truth we discovered in interpretation
All Scripture <i>is</i> given by inspiration of God, and <i>is</i> profitable for doctrine, for reproof, fo correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16–17, NKJV)
Three questions to consider about a passage when developing applications:
(1) What is the timeless truth or principle in the passage?(2) What specific steps of practice can we develop from the principles (application)?
 interpretation – original intent or a principles Potentially, specific steps of obedience (application)
Developing the Timeless Truth or Principle
some passages are non-moral, non-theological subjects that have no "timeless truth." (sxample: "See what large letters I use as I write to you with my own hand!" (Gal. 6:11)
Many passages do address moral, theological subjects that do have "timeless truths" The goal is to discover the principles that are not limited to or
Key questions to ask about the passage to uncover the timeless truths: What does the passage teach: About God?
About man?
About other people?
About sin?

What commands are we to obey?

Developing the Applications

If a major purpose of Scripture is "so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work," then "application" is the step which changes my life and specifies what I need to do (obedience).
